

HEALTH POWER COMMUNITY SURVEY



We have a Vision of creating strong, thriving, healthy, and equitable communities in Duluth's Lincoln Park neighborhood. In the spring and summer months of 2020, LPCFC's Health POWER team conducted a community survey to better assess the needs of the Lincoln Park community and its families. In total, 172 community members were surveyed.

Over half of those surveyed were between the ages of **18** and **44** and identify female. **71%** were BIPOC.

Fewer than **20%** own their homes, overwhelmingly people in Lincoln park rent.

Youth surveyed view **electronic cigarettes** as the greatest issue facing their peers.

Most are **happy** living in Lincoln Park and find lots of ways to **stay active** in the summer months.

People were most interested in **cleaning up** the streets, adding street lights, **addressing addiction**, and **creating sober spaces**.

68% say they've had trouble accessing **healthy food**.

The **#1** problem facing Lincoln Park residents is access to **healthy food**.

“There is nowhere nearby for me to purchase healthy food. I am thankful for Kwik Trip, but I don't feel that it is sufficient to obtain healthy food there.”

“The hills, the bike trails in the park and flat surfaces make Lincoln Park a great place to get exercise.”
