Health POWER



The Center for Prevention at Blue Cross and Blue Shield Minnesota selected LPCFC to participate in the Health POWER (People Organizing and Working for Equitable Results) funding initiative. The initiative's aim is to address health inequities through community action. LPCFC organized a canvassing event to conduct interviews with community members about their experience living in Lincoln Park. The interviews focus on issues relating to physical activity, healthy eating, and reducing commercial tobacco use. So far the canvassing team has conducted over 170 surveys. The interviews are coming to a close and key points are being selected from the responses. Then a community coalition will be formed and trained on how to address these issues to help the community take action.



One of the reoccurring key points found in the canvassing interviews was a lack of access to healthy foods. LPCFC has many plans to address this issue and one has been completed! At the beginning of September, the Harrison Park Orchard was completed with the help of many wonderful volunteers! LPCFC was able to plant twelve fruit trees, including apple, pear, plum, peach and cherry trees. Next summer some of the trees will bear fruit and community members will be able to stop by and grab some. Head on down to Harrison Park to check it out!

Big Red Bookshelf

Through #GiveAtHomeMN and our online Duluth Opoly fundraiser, we raised over \$2,500 for the Big Red Bookshelf! We used those funds to purchase new books for the shelves and update our bookshelf area. One of the goals set by the Big Red Bookshelf Coalition this year has been to provide books that better represent the culturally diverse populations that the program serves. We are excited to keep working on this goal using the funds raised in recent months.


Donations
